Using a ruler at home, can you find and measure 5 items that are longer than 20cm and 5 items that are shorter than 5 times? As an extra challenge, you could order your items from shortest to longest.	Visit the local library and borrow some non- fiction books about animals. Can you show your grownups at home how to use a contents page? What new facts can you find out about different animals? We would love to hear your animal facts on Tapestry.
Create a piece of artwork to show us your favourite animal. You could use any type of art materials that you have at home. Look carefully at your animal's special markings, do they have any prints that you could include in your artwork?	Log into Education City using your account details. Play the games/ complete the activities that we have allocated to you in the classwork section. These games have been chosen specifically to reinforce some of the learning that we are completing in school this half term.	Make a fact file of your favourite animal. You could include information about what the animal looks like, where it lives, what it eats (carnivore, herbivore or omnivore) and which group it belongs to (mammal, fish, bird, retile or amphibian.) You could design the fact file yourself or use a computer to help you.
