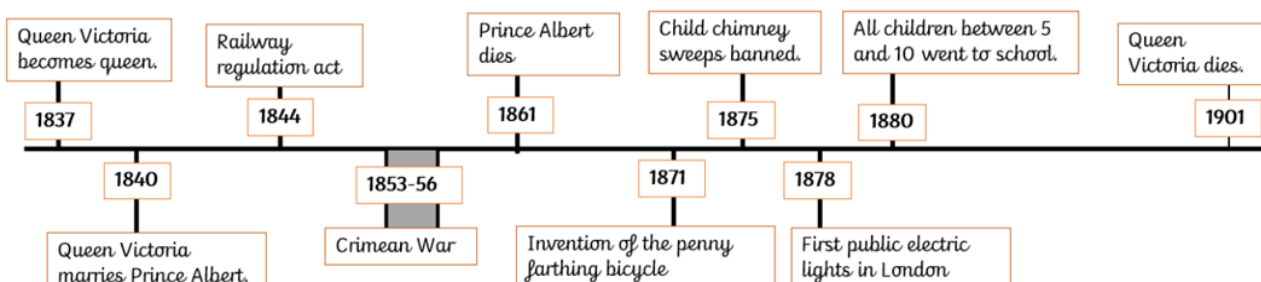

- The Victorian era was from 1837. It was a time of huge change which has impacted our lives today.
- Victorians were people who lived during the reign of Queen Victoria.
- Queen Victoria became queen in 1837 and died in 1901.
- She married her cousin Prince Albert who was from Germany.
- Lots of the Christmas traditions we have are because of the Victorians.
- Queen Victoria visited Leamington Priors when she was a princess and because of her the town became 'Royal Leamington Spa'.
- In Victorian times a law was made to make sure every child in Britain between the ages of five and ten went to school.
- Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole were people who made changes to healthcare during the Crimean War.
- There were lots of new inventions during this time including electricity, telephones and cameras.
- People were able to use new forms of transport such as trains, cars and bicycles.
