You said	We are doing
After school events are difficult to attend, more advance notice and a variety of days would be beneficial.	From September 2024 we will trial Celebration of Learning events before and at the end of the day on a variety of days (this year they are on a variety of days but all at 2.45pm). We will ensure that welcome, information and assessment evenings are not all on Wednesdays. We will aim to confirm as many dates as possible at the beginning of the September for that academic year.
Recording reading at home on tapestry is difficult. It would be good to have more reading books sent home and for parents/carers to have a better understanding of what and how reading is taught in school.	Please see the 'A Parent/Carer Guide to Reading at TIS' that will be issued shortly after the Easter break. Children can change their book twice a week, but we do ask the children if they have read it. If they haven't, we ask you support them to do so before changing it, to develop heathy reading habits. We will explore the benefits and restrictions of paper reading diaries for parents to use from September.
Trips are a great learning experience. But how do I volunteer for them and why can't I be with my child? How do you decide where to go on trips?	Please see the 'A Parent/Carer Guide to external visits at TIS' that will be issued shortly after the Easter break which answers all these questions and more.
More availability is needed at SMILES breakfast and after school club.	We understand that wrap around care is vitally important for working parents. We are currently reviewing our provision and will inform parents as soon as possible about our plans to provide more places. This will be a phased approach between now and September 2026 in line with new government guidelines for wrap around care.
After school clubs are a fantastic opportunity for the children to extend their skills and friendships. Many suggestions of new clubs were made.	We pride ourselves on offering a wide range of after school clubs. Unfortunately, some clubs are offered and then do not run because the uptake is not high enough. Sometimes external providers decide to stop clubs that they previously offered. Rugby will be starting in September, and we will investigate the possibility of a gymnastics club.
We would like INSET dates and other events to be synced with the Junior school.	The junior and infant school liaise, and we try our best to sync dates where we can. Sometimes as we are separate schools, this is not always possible. Our school council represent our pupil voice and take a lead on deciding our approach to charity events (such as non uniform) which will not always be the same taken as the Junior school. We will continue to give as much notice about INSET days and other events as we can.
