| Communication and Language: Listening, attention and understanding The children will developing their listening skills as they learn lots of new facts throughout our new topic and developing their questioning skills. We will be using a range of online videos and information to find out about Minibeasts and will learn lots of new Makaton signs to support this too. <u>Speaking</u> As they talk to others around them, they will be encouraged to explain their ideas and extend their sentences with added detail. | Mathematics: The children will continue to consolidate their understanding of simple and complex patterns. The children will be using their addition and subtraction skills by using a story structure of first, then and now to solve simple number problems. We will be counting and comparing numbers up to 20 and revising one more and one less. The children will learn what doubling means and apply double fact to problems up to double 5. | Understanding the World: <u>People Culture and communities</u> The children will learn about the stories which are special to Christians and Muslims. <u>The natural world</u> The children will learn all about different Minibeasts and their habitats and consolidate this learning with a trip to Ryton Pools. We will also plant sunflowers as part of Science week and learn about what they need to grow. Together we will plant seeds in the outside classroom. We are hoping to observe some caterpillars turning into butterflies. | Expressive Arts and Design: <u>Creating with materials</u> The children will be using a range of skills and materials to design and make Minibeasts and drawing observational sketches of animals. <u>Being imaginative and expressive</u> The role- play area is a Minibeast investigation area to help the children to use the vocabulary associated with the topic.
